Report of Discussion on Social Realities

Report of Session on Leadership – Six Thinking Hats

Objectives

- To introduce students to the Six Thinking Hats model as an effective tool for leadership and problem-solving.
- To enhance critical thinking and decision-making skills through structured mental frameworks.
- To encourage team collaboration, creativity, and analytical thinking in approaching real-life challenges.

The AICUF unit of Holy Cross College (Autonomous), Nagercoil conducted a session on “Leadership – Six Thinking Hats” on 11th September 2025 in the Golden Jubilee Hall. The session was facilitated by Dr. Sr. Antin Mary, AICUF Coordinator.

Dr. Sr. Antin Mary explained Edward de Bono’s Six Thinking Hats technique. Through interactive examples, students were encouraged to apply each hat to everyday situations and leadership scenarios. The session included group activities where students practiced switching between different thinking perspectives to analyze problems and propose effective solutions. The activities helped participants understand the importance of balanced thinking in leadership.

The programme concluded with a reflection session, where students shared insights on how the Six Hats method can help them in academics, teamwork and personal decision-making.

Outcome:

Students gained a clear understanding of the Six Thinking Hats model and its application in leadership. The session motivated students to adopt structured thinking patterns for better decision-making in academic and personal contexts.

Impact:

The session encouraged students to view problems from multiple perspectives and make balanced decisions. It strengthened their leadership mindset, improved teamwork, and enhanced their ability to think critically while addressing real-life challenges.
