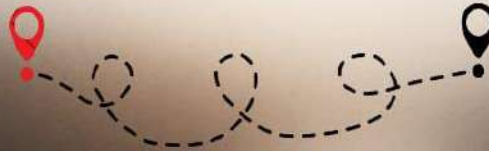

Report on Heritage Walk

Objectives

1. To create awareness among students about the importance of local heritage and historical sites.
2. To familiarize students with the artifacts and archival collections preserved at the Charithra Museum, Neyyattinkara.
3. To promote experiential learning by connecting classroom knowledge with firsthand historical evidence.
4. To encourage interest in heritage conservation and responsible tourism.
5. To enhance understanding of regional history and cultural continuity.

Report

A Heritage Walk was organized by the YUVA Tourism Club on 03 December 2025 to the Charithra Museum, Neyyattinkara, with the objective of promoting awareness about local history, cultural heritage, and heritage tourism among students. The programme was coordinated by Dr. S. Mary Judit. The Charithra Museum at Neyyattinkara preserves a rich collection of historical artifacts that reflect the socio-cultural, political, and economic history of the Travancore region. The museum exhibits include traditional weapons, coins, inscriptions, sculptures, household utensils, manuscripts, and archival materials. These exhibits provided students with a comprehensive understanding of the region's historical evolution and cultural traditions. During the heritage walk, students were guided through different sections of the museum by the museum authorities, who explained the historical significance, origin, and function of the displayed artifacts. The visit enabled students to directly observe primary sources of history and gain practical exposure to heritage studies.
