



On the human health front, the microbiome influences digestion, immune function, and even mental health through the gut-brain axis. Maintaining a balanced microbiome through diet, probiotics, and exposure to diverse environments is essential for overall well-being. Furthermore, research suggests a link between agricultural practices, microbial diversity in the environment, and human microbiome health. Understanding these connections can pave the way for interdisciplinary approaches that benefit both agricultural sustainability and human health in tandem. Thus, nurturing healthy microbiomes in agricultural systems can yield positive outcomes for ecosystems, food production, and human health, forming a cornerstone of holistic sustainable development.





HAEMOGLOBIN CHECK- UP



The Haemoglobin Test Program, conducted from February 20th to 21st, 2024, was a joint initiative by the Department of Zoology and the Health and Hygiene Committee of Holy Cross College (Autonomous), Nagercoil, in collaboration with our industrial partner, Catherine Booth Hospital, Nagercoil, as per our Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).
