Consumer Club

Awareness Programme on Food Adulteration

Eco Club

Talk on Pollution Free Land

In observance of National Pollution Control Day, the Eco Club, in collaboration with the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), organized an expert talk on "Pollution Free Land" on December 2, 2025, at Sr. Emilie's Seminar Hall. The environmental program successfully motivated 34 student participants to implement green habits like plastic reduction, waste segregation, and proactive land resource preservation



Plant Donation Drive at Thollavillai

To scale up community environmental action, the Eco Club conducted a "Plant Donation Drive" at Thollavillai Village on December 05, 2025. Through the active participation of 46 students, native saplings were distributed to 10 selected rural households and a local hospital, effectively improving neighborhood green cover and local ecosystem health.

Nature Nurture Drive

On December 11, 2025, the Eco Club executed a campus-wide "Nature Nurture Drive" aimed at systematically tackling plastic waste accumulation. The cleanliness campaign mobilized 110 student participants who collected and safely segregated waste into allotted bins, promoting an eco-friendly campus model and deep-running conservation duties.



Seed Distribution Drive at Kurusady

The Eco Club organized a community extension program on December 19, 2025, at Kurusady, focusing on promoting sustainable organic home gardening. During the event, 85 student volunteers distributed three specialized seed packets per household to 15 rural families, guiding them on cultivation techniques for a healthier domestic environment.

Orientation on Thooimai Mission

Supporting state-level clean environment mandates, the Eco Club conducted an orientation session on the Government of Tamil Nadu's "Thooimai Mission" on January 7, 2026, at Kurusady. Led by resource person Dr. M.F. Anne Feril, the training session aligned student club members with standardized waste management protocols and sustainable community hygienic practices.



Homes for Wings Initiative

Talk on Waste Management

The Eco Club held an enlightening educational session at the Golden Jubilee Hall on February 24, 2026, featuring an expert talk on "Waste Management" by Ms. A.R. Jemi, Assistant Professor of English. Attended by 81 participants, the seminar offered practical guidance on composting organic waste, segregating biodegradable items, and minimizing plastic usage. The event wrapped up with a prize distribution ceremony celebrating the student winners of the club's "Reusing Plastics" and poster presentation contests.



Street Play on Plastic Pollution

On February 27, 2026, eight energetic Eco Club volunteers staged a captivating street play focused on the "Impacts of Using Plastics" at the College Portico. Through a lively performance, the students effectively dramatized how rampant plastic utilization triggers environmental pollution, damages wildlife, and threatens public health, while advocating for sustainable alternatives like cloth bags. The environmental campaign successfully gathered and sensitized an appreciative audience of 85 students, teachers, and non-teaching staff members.

Electoral Literacy Club

Demonstration on Gender Equity

With active participants, the outdoor awareness campaign aimed to sensitize both the student community and the general public on issues related to gender discrimination. Voter's ID Form Filling Drive

The training featured an expert address by Mr. Anto Valan, Booth Level Officer (BLO) of Nagercoil, who explained the legal eligibility criteria, document updates, and online application protocols. The hands-on workshop provided real-time assistance to students, enabling a significant number of eligible institutional youth to successfully initiate and complete their official voter registration process.

Health and Hygiene Committee

Medical Inspection for First-Year Students

A comprehensive medical inspection camp was organized for first-year undergraduate students on January 6 and 7, 2026, at the college Multipurpose Hall. Jointly coordinated by the Department of Physical Education and the Health & Hygiene Committee, the check-up benefited 440 students through basic screenings for height, weight, blood pressure, eyes, and dental health. Supported by a medical team of six doctors, four nurses, and 46 nursing students, the camp successfully encouraged early health detection and sensitized participants to nutritional and healthy dietary practices.



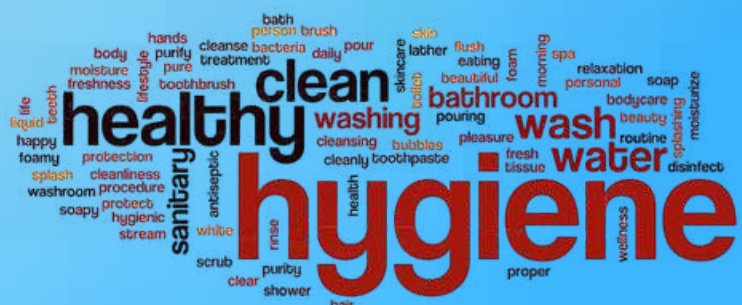
Health Awareness Programmes

The Health and Hygiene Committee organized various health awareness programmes on 25 March, 2026 to promote personal hygiene and healthy living among students. A mass deworming drive was conducted through the distribution of Albendazole tablets to 1,500 beneficiaries under medical guidance, creating awareness on hygiene and sanitation. A seminar on “Millets in the Modern Diet” highlighted the nutritional benefits of millets and healthy food habits, while a Self-Hygiene Awareness and Sanitary Napkin Distribution Drive promoted menstrual hygiene and health awareness among students. The programmes successfully encouraged healthy lifestyle practices and well-being.



First Aid Awareness & Emergency Care Program

The Health and Hygiene Committee hosted an informative First Aid Awareness & Emergency Care Program on April 9, 2026. Coordinated by Dr. L. Deva Vijila and Dr. N. Saromi, the session equipped the student beneficiaries with essential, practical life-saving skills, including wound care, fracture management, and burn treatment. 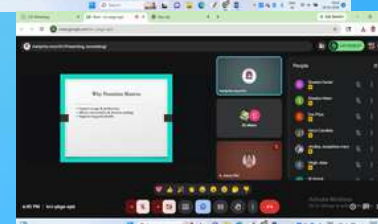


Orientation Programme for Non-Teaching Staff
